





105,000 immigrants in the Washington D.C. metro area are **entrepreneurs**.*



35,500 immigrants in Prince George's County are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.

Economic and labor force contributions

Immigrants in the Washington D.C. metro area, which includes Prince George's County, and Maryland contribute critical tax dollars to the local economy and are indispensable members of the workforce.

Washington D.C. Metro Area

\$65.9B Immigrant-led households **earned \$65.9 billion.**

\$6.2B Immigrants contributed **\$6.2 billion** in combined **state and local taxes.**

\$13.3B Immigrants contributed **\$13.3 billion** in **federal taxes.**

\$46.4B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$46.4 billion** in **spending power.**

Maryland

\$40.6B Immigrant-led households **earned \$40.6 billion.**


\$4.2B Immigrants contributed **\$4.2 billion** in combined **state and local taxes.**

\$7.5B Immigrants contributed **\$7.5 billion** in **federal taxes.**

\$28.9B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$28.9 billion** in **spending power.**


Labor force participation

Prince George's County




163,900 immigrant workers comprise **30 percent** of the labor force.


Maryland



658,800 immigrant workers comprise **20 percent** of the state's labor force.



78 percent of immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the native-born population (68 percent).



74 percent of the state's immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the state's native-born population (66 percent).
