Incarceration at a glance

Of all counties in California in 2021, Glenn County has the eighth highest county jail incarceration rate.

Glenn County has:

- 1 county jail
- O state prisons
- 0 juvenile facilities

On an average day in 2021, there were 73 people in county jails and 71 people from Glenn County in the state prison system.

In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 424 arrests and 1,326 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 40 people to state prison.




79 percent of all arrests in Glenn County in 2021 were for misdemeanors.


83 percent of people in jail in Glenn are pretrial, meaning they have not been convicted of charges filed against them.

Glenn County general fund spending, fiscal year 2021



In 2021, Glenn County used 24% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$18 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.
