Incarceration at a glance

Of all counties in California in 2021, Inyo County has the **tenth highest** arrest rate, **seventh highest** county jail incarceration rate, **second highest** per capita spending on jails and detention, and **sixth highest** arrest rate of Latinx people.

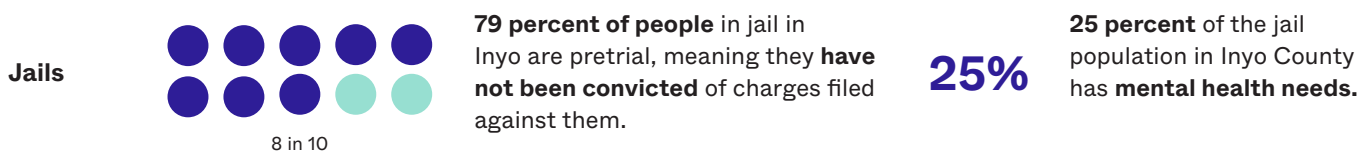
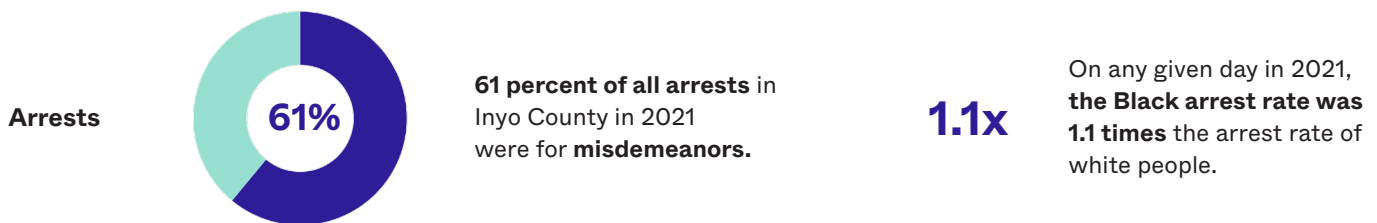
Inyo County has:

- 1 county jail
- 0 state prisons
- 1 juvenile facility

On an average day in 2021, there were 45 people in county jails and 29 people from Inyo County in the state prison system.

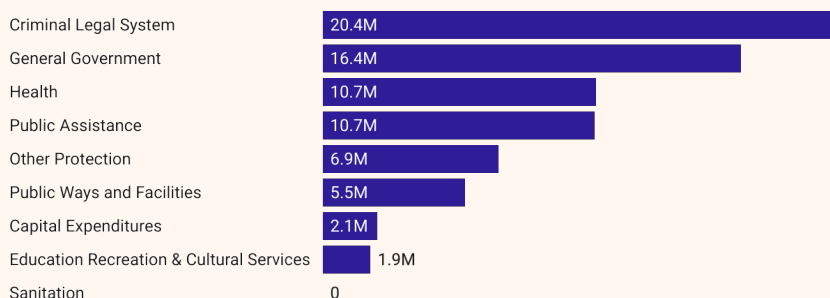
In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 679 arrests and 521 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 19 people to state prison.

Looking across the system



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Inyo County general fund spending, fiscal year 2021



In 2021, Inyo County used 27% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$20.4 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.

Within criminal legal system spending

- 41%** goes to law enforcement (Sheriff)
- 42%** goes to detention and probation
- 17%** goes to judicial expenses
