Incarceration at a glance

Of all counties in California in 2021, Lake County has the **third highest** arrest rate, **fourth highest** county jail incarceration rate, **sixth highest** arrest rate of Black people, and **eighth highest** arrest rate of Latinx people.

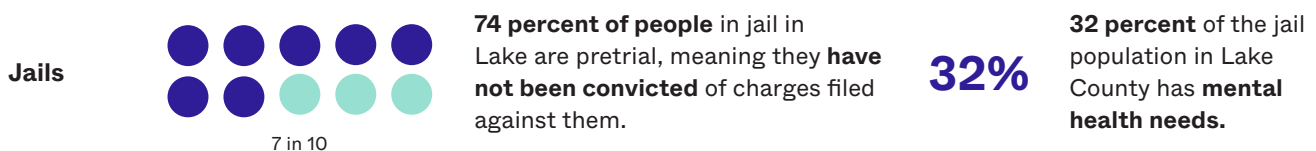
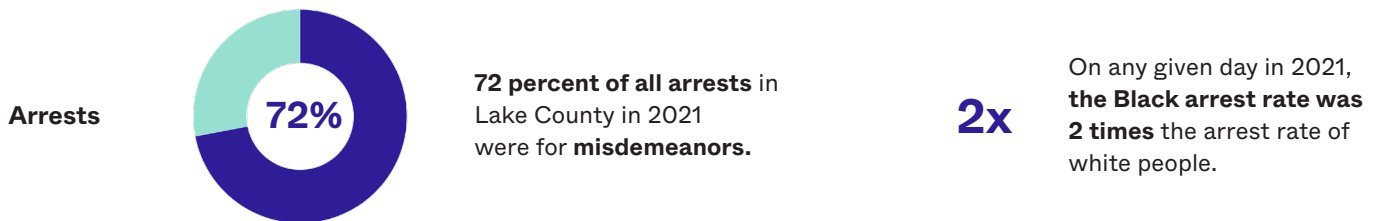
Lake County has:

- 1 county jail
- 0 state prisons
- 0 juvenile facilities

On an average day in 2021, there were 182 people in county jails and 234 people from Lake County in the state prison system.

In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 2,920 arrests and 2,673 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 151 people to state prison.

In 2021, Lake County used 65% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$31.7 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.

Within criminal legal system spending

- 38%** goes to law enforcement (Sheriff)
- 46%** goes to detention and probation
- 16%** goes to judicial expenses
