Incarceration at a glance

Of all counties in California in 2021, Madera County has the tenth highest county jail incarceration rate.

Madera County has:

- 1 county jail
- 2 state prisons
- 4 juvenile facilities

On an average day in 2021, there were 402 people in county jails and 557 people from Madera County in the state prison system.

In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 4,865 arrests and 4,586 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 260 people to state prison.




67 percent of all arrests in Madera County in 2021 were for **misdemeanors**.


81 percent of people in jail in Madera are pretrial, meaning they **have not been convicted** of charges filed against them.

Madera County general fund spending, fiscal year 2021



In 2021, Madera County used 26% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$67.3 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.

Within criminal legal system spending

36% goes to law enforcement (Sheriff)

42% goes to detention and probation

22% goes to judicial expenses
