Marin County has:



On an average day in 2021, there were 201 people in county jails and 181 people from Marin County in the state prison system.

In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 3,939 arrests and 4,995 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 39 people to state prison.

Looking across the system






75 percent of all arrests in Marin County in 2021 were for **misdemeanors**.


84 percent of people in jail in Marin are pretrial, meaning they have not been convicted of charges filed against them.

Marin County general fund spending, fiscal year 2021



In 2021, Marin County used 35% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$109.8 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.

42% goes to detention and probation

23% goes to judicial expenses
