Incarceration at a glance

Of all counties in California in 2021, Napa County has the **fourth highest** per capita spending on jails and detention.

Napa County has:

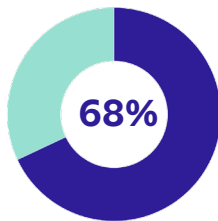
- 2** county jails
- 0** state prisons
- 2** juvenile facilities

On an average day in 2021, there were 196 people in county jails and 271 people from Napa County in the state prison system.

In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 3,335 arrests and 3,619 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 113 people to state prison.

Arrests

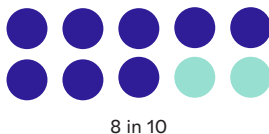


68 percent of all arrests in Napa County in 2021 were for **misdemeanors**.

Jails



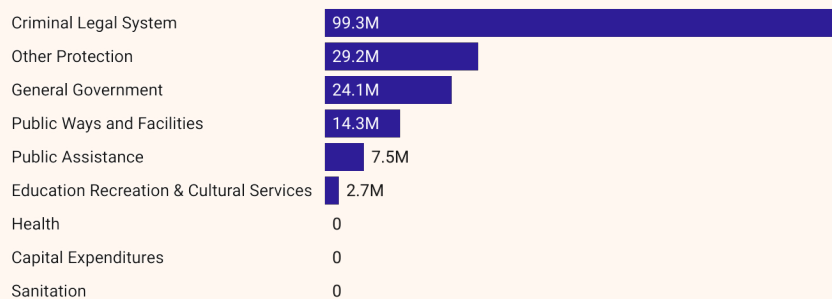
76 percent of people in jail in Napa are pretrial, meaning they **have not been convicted** of charges filed against them.

33%

33 percent of the jail population in Napa County has **mental health needs**.

Napa County general fund spending, fiscal year 2021



In 2021, Napa County used 56% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$99.3 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.

Within criminal legal system spending

- 38%** goes to law enforcement (Sheriff)
- 42%** goes to detention and probation
- 20%** goes to judicial expenses
