On an average day in 2021, there were 37 people in county jails and 35 people from Plumas County in the state prison system.

In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 478 arrests and 751 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 15 people to state prison.




73 percent of all arrests in Plumas County in 2021 were for misdemeanors.


63 percent of people in jail in Plumas are pretrial, meaning they have not been convicted of charges filed against them.
