Incarceration at a glance

Of all counties in California in 2021, Sacramento County has the **sixth highest** county jail population and **sixth most** people sent to state prisons.

Sacramento County has:

- 2 county jails
- 2 state prisons
- 2 juvenile facilities

On an average day in 2021, there were 3,212 people in county jails and 5,373 people from Sacramento County in the state prison system.

In 2021, law enforcement agencies made 25,399 arrests and 26,730 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 1,390 people to state prison.




50 percent of all arrests in Sacramento County in 2021 were for misdemeanors.


69 percent of people in jail in Sacramento are pretrial, meaning they have not been convicted of charges filed against them.

Sacramento County general fund spending, fiscal year 2021



In 2021, Sacramento County used 34% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$876.7 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.
