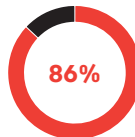

Local community ties



87,800 immigrants in Prince George's County have lived in the United States for **more than 15 years**.



31,000 immigrants in Prince George's County are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.



35,800 immigrants in Prince George's County are **homeowners**.



66 percent of immigrants over the age of 25 living in Prince George's County are **high school graduates**, and more than a quarter have pursued higher education.

Economic and labor force contributions

Immigrants in Prince George's County and Maryland contribute critical tax dollars to the local economy and are indispensable members of the workforce.

Prince George's County

(Congressional Districts 4 & 5)

\$7.4B immigrant-led households **earned \$7.4 billion.**

\$671M immigrants contributed **\$671 million** in combined **state and local taxes.**

\$1.4B immigrants contributed **\$1.4 billion** in **federal taxes.**

\$5.3B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$5.3 billion** in **spending power.**

Maryland

\$35.2B immigrant-led households **earned \$35.2 billion.**

\$3.3B immigrants contributed **\$3.3 billion** in combined **state and local taxes.**

\$6.9B immigrants contributed **\$6.9 billion** in **federal taxes.**

\$25B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$25 billion** in **spending power.**

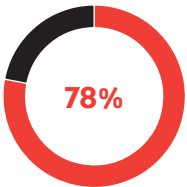
Labor force participation

Prince George's County



142,500 immigrant workers comprise 29 percent of the county's labor force, or **one in four.**

1 in 4



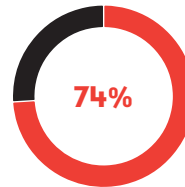
78 percent of the county's immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the county's native-born population (69 percent).

Maryland



614,200 immigrant workers comprise 20 percent of the state's labor force, or **one in five.**

1 in 5



74 percent of the state's immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the state's native-born population (67 percent).
