







Local community ties



85,900 immigrants have lived in the New Haven metro area **since 2009 or earlier**.



At least **28,200** homes in the New Haven metro area are **owned by immigrants**.



7,000 immigrants in the New Haven metro area are **entrepreneurs**.



16,700 immigrants in the New Haven metro area are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.

Economic and labor force contributions

Immigrants in New Haven and Connecticut contribute critical tax dollars to the local economy and are indispensable members of the workforce.

New Haven Metro Area

\$4.1B Immigrant-led households earned **\$4.1 billion**.

\$452.9M Immigrants contributed **\$452.9 million** in combined **state and local taxes**.

\$764.7M Immigrants contributed **\$764.7 million** in **federal taxes**.

\$2.9B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$2.9 billion** in **spending power**.

Connecticut

\$24.3B Immigrant-led households earned **\$24.3 billion**.


\$2.6B Immigrants contributed **\$2.6 billion** in combined **state and local taxes**.

\$4.7B Immigrants contributed **\$4.7 billion** in **federal taxes**.

\$17B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$17 billion** in **spending power**.


Labor force participation

New Haven Metro Area




75,900 immigrant workers comprise **16 percent** of the labor force.


Connecticut



356,000 immigrant workers comprise **18 percent** of the state's labor force.



69 percent of immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the native-born population (65 percent).



70 percent of the state's immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the state's native-born population (65 percent).
